In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present; apologies from one councillor and the District Councillor were accepted and there were no declarations of interest. The Council approved minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held on September 13th 2023, and these were signed. Under matters arising on Eagle Road' priority a councillor reported back on the site meeting with Norfolk County Council and the actions agreed; a response is awaited from NCC. The proposed path from Eagle Road to the Village Hall was being repriced by North Norfolk District Council further advice is awaited. On waste and dog bins, following representation by the Clerk to NNDC this seem to be resolved and the bins are now collected regularly. The council were grateful to a member who had prepared the proposal for a cycle rack at the bus stop on the A140 (S) and the project would proceed with written permission, and quotes for the base and racks. The site grass cutting would be taken over by the Council.

On planning the Council has no objection to the change of use from agricultural to dog walking at a field off Ingworth Rd, Banningham. The applications for extensions at 13 John Franklin Way, an extension at 2 Ives Way, Erpingham, and the log cabin at Erpingham School, have all been approved.

Under finance the Clerk reported that the second-half precept had been received and a PAYE payment made; he had requested a quote for next year's grass cutting contract, and a query over electricity meter readings was resolved. Advice about the 2023 Clerk's pay review had been received and the Council agreed to put this into effect, including back-pay. A wreath had been obtained for the Remembrance service. The Clerk reminded members that the January agenda will include an item on grants to village groups. In a review of budgets for 23-24 and proposals for 2024-2025 the Council made changes to village support and play area allocations, and the budget was then agreed. The Council decided to set the precept next year (2024-2025) at £12936 - the parish precept continues to be well under the national and NNDC average. The Council approved payments for grass cutting, electricity, HMRC, paye, the play area annual report, the waste/dog bin collections charges, an election 2023 charge, a grant to the Royal British Legion, the Clerk's back pay and salary.

In the Chairman's absence Gerry Cox took the chair and the Council reviewed the annual inspection report for the play area which had been circulated to members and a small working party would review the issues raised and plan for any upgrades needed. In reports the Council heard updates on the MUGA, Safer Neighbourhood priorities, the defibrillator, the SAM signs and the Remembrance service. Comments on sewage discharge and planning implications were aired; flooding on the common and a broken manhole cover were reported. The Clerk's reported that the District Council were preparing evening briefings on planning so any member interested should liaise with the Clerk to identify their preferred location. The Clerk would prepare requests for MUGA and the football club contributions and he advised that the next scheduled meeting would be on Wednesday 10th January 2024; he passed out a report from the District Councillor. In open meeting Village Hall matters were raised and the Council would consider these at the next meeting. With no other business Gerry Cox closed the meeting at 21.35.
