

April letter

Last month's letter was rather sombre. Indeed there is much to be sombre about in the world and in our own lives, but as we approach Easter the mood in the church changes. We think about love, hope and joy and the Christian belief that this world does not have the last word. To mark this, the church will be full of spring flowers. Love triumphs.

Couples often choose a reading from one of St Paul's letters for their wedding service.

"Love is patient and kind. Love envies no one, is never rude; love is never selfish, never quick to take offence. Love keeps no score of wrongs, takes no pleasure in the failures of others, but delights in the truth. There is nothing love cannot face; there is no limit to its faith, its hope, its endurance. There are three things that last forever: faith, hope and love and the greatest of these is love."



What couples often don't realise is that this is not a letter about romantic love. It was written to a group of Christians who were falling out with each other. It was ever thus! Today the Church of England is deeply divided by the issue of same sex marriage. The debate, quite often unkind, has been going on for 10 years with no resolution but much hurt.

What Paul was trying to get across to those little groups of Christians forming the first churches was that love matters more than anything. He was also saying that loving someone doesn't automatically mean that patience, kindness and unselfishness automatically flow from loving someone. He was saying that, in order to love, these are the things you must strive for. I'm still striving - ask Philip about my patience!

So in this dark and sombre world we can make a difference. We believe that Jesus made a difference. He didn't triumph by the sword or power. He allowed himself to be put to death in the most cruel way. But on Easter Day Christians believe love won. Don't ask me what exactly happened. It is a mystery, but I believe Easter means this world does not have the last word and that there is a world of light, love and joy ahead of us.

My Dad chose "In heavenly love abiding" for my Granny's funeral nearly 50 years ago and I have always loved it.

The last verse –

"Green pastures are before me,
which yet I have not seen;
bright skies will soon be o'er me,
where the dark clouds have been.
My hope I cannot measure,
my path to life is free,
my Saviour has my treasure,
and he will walk with me."



And finally - I welcome gay couples into church and believe in the opening words of the marriage service:

God is love and those who live in love, live in God and God lives in them.


HEALING MINISTRY

From the earliest times Christians were involved in prayers for healing.

Religious communities offered hospitality to the sick, grew and used herbs to help with healing through the ages, and they were the founders of hospitals. We are following in this tradition and will be offering laying-on of hands, and prayers for healing, at the end of the service on the first Sunday of each month at Erpingham.



During this time the choir will sing or the organist will play. Requests for prayer will be confidential. It will be a time when the congregation will keep silent prayer. Prayer such as this often brings comfort. We offer this healing prayer to anyone who would like to come, and we welcome you to church.



We welcome everyone to the Holy Week services

Palm Sunday 29th March marks the beginning of Holy Week and is the day we remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people cheered and waved palms. Palm crosses are given at the service.

Compline is a short service which is said at the end of the day. It is quiet and reflective and includes some silence.

Stations of the Cross takes us to each station in Calthorpe church at which we have a short reflection on Jesus' journey to the cross.

Maundy Thursday is a service of Holy Communion at the end of which we remove candlesticks and cross and the altar is stripped and left bare. This is done in silence and we leave church in silence.

Good Friday includes bible readings, reflections and hymns.


Holy Saturday, we burn the Christmas tree and as a sign of the light of Christ coming at Easter we carry candles into church. There we renew our baptism vows and are sprinkled with water.

Easter Day Holy Communion to celebrate Jesus Resurrection.

I am always happy to talk to anyone about the worship in the churches in the benefice - Alby, Calthorpe, Erpingham, Gunton, Hanworth and Thwaite. Sometimes it is hard to cross the threshold and I understand that.





News from the Ingworth Parish Council.

The Parish Council met on 26th February 2026

The safety work on the trees in the playground which had been encroaching on the play equipment has been carried out. This should ensure that the equipment is not overhung by branches and that more light gets to the equipment keeping it drier.

The Council has also been looking at the future of the playground which is owned by North Norfolk District Council but managed by the Parish Council under agreement. We are looking at what repairs are necessary and whether the Parish Council could take on ownership in the future.

As you will all be aware, the issue of traffic speeding through the village is an on-going problem which the Parish Council is trying to address. We are meeting with the County Council's Highways Engineer at the end of March, along with our local County Councillor to explain the problem, present the evidence that we have obtained from the Speed Awareness Monitor and hopefully come up with some practical solutions.

This year's Annual Parish Meeting has been set for Thursday 28th May and will be held in the Church. Do come along to hear what the Council has been up to in the previous year, have your say on anything you would like to see happen in the parish and join us for some refreshments afterwards in the pleasant surroundings of the churchyard. You'll be able to see the new thatching which has taken place on the porch and tower.

Report of Erpingham with Calthorpe Parish Council held on Meeting Wednesday 11th March 2026

In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present and apologies were received from Cllr

Bill Goreham. There were no Declarations of interest. The Council approved the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held on January 14th 2026. Under matters arising the Clerk had asked Norfolk County Council for an update on School Road and been advised that the work was scheduled for April onwards but might be brought forward. There had been contact with the County Councillor following many concerns about the road condition. The Clerk had progressed a new grit bin for Jubilee Close with the Highways Engineer and the request would be considered during the 'gritting review' at the end of the winter.

On finance the Clerk reported that the Information Commissioner had confirmed the Council's Registration for the current year. The next payment to HMRC for paye would include a credit from a previous year. A new instruction to the Council's bank is required to ensure the Clerk's pay Standing Order reconciles with the total payslip amounts for the year (25-26). The November cheque to the Play Inspection Co had not been received by them so the Clerk would re-issue the cheque in April. Roger Canwell had agreed to carry out the Internal Audit again this year in April. The Council approved payments for Erpingham PCC, Calthorpe Town Lands Trust (Calthorpe Friends) the Clerk's expenses (Sep-Feb), a first payment for the new path clearing, Norfolk PTS subscription, the Clerk's salary [Feb, Mar] and the HMRC paye/NIC due in April.

Under the play area Health and Safety there was no report; the Council would plan for minor works to be carried out. The Council revisited plans to finance the play area in the long term. On the new Path Project the work had been delayed due to the adverse weather but the hedge/overhang cutting back had been undertaken and the path work was expected to start at the end of the month. The Chairman added that North Norfolk District Council would need to be advised of the start date and 'closure notices' would need to be posted.

The meeting was adjourned to allow Cllr S Penfold (NCC) to discuss Highways items. A speed limit of 30 mph near the A140 was proposed and the issues around a 20 mph limit in the village were aired. Alternative proposals should be considered. He was apprised of the Council concerns about School Road. He would write to the Highways Engineer about these items and support the Council's request for an additional grit bin. He also pledged a fund of around £750 towards new benches on the new path. The Council thanked him for his support and the meeting resumed.

In reports the Chairman would decide shortly when to hold the Annual Parish Meeting and the next scheduled Council Meeting will be the Annual Meeting of the Council to be held on Wednesday May 13th 2026. In members' reports the Council heard that the MUGA resurfacing is due for May and replacements defibrillator pads are on order. The Chairman would ask if a substitute can be sent to the Aylsham TC chairmen's meetings; also that Calthorpe Town Lands Trust are considering a location for a defibrillator. With no other business the meeting closed at 20.45.
