February letter

A belated Happy New Year to all!

By the time you read this, January will have come and gone, the mornings and evenings are getting lighter and, even if the weather is still cold and dreary, spring will not be far away. February is, of course, the shortest month of the year, and one with no particular events of festivals to mark it. Except, perhaps, the gradual appearance of red hearts, red roses, and romantic gifts, since February does mark St Valentine's Day, when there is emphasis on love. But why? Was there a St Valentine?

If so, who was he, and why is he associated with love? As with most early saints and martyrs, accurate details are greatly lacking. However, the main facts about Valentine seem to be the following. He was a Christian priest, born about 226 in Terni in Umbria, Italy, where he probably eventually became bishop. During his lifetime there was persecution of Christians throughout the Roman Empire, Valentinus (his Roman name), was alleged to have been executed for ministering to Christian believers and refusing to deny his Christian faith. This took place on February 14, c 269, the day which has been kept as his feast day ever since.

The story goes that, when Valentinus, along with other Christians, was arrested, the judge, Asterius, brought before him his blind daughter and said that if Valentinus could restore her sight he, Asterius, and his family would convert to Christianity. Her sight was restored and the judge and his family were baptised. As a result Asterius freed all Christians under his authority. However, persecution continued and Valentinus was arrested again and sent to the Roman Emperor of the time, Claudius II, and as a consequence, having refused to renounce his faith, was condemned to death.

One of the legends giving rise to the association with love and lovers was said to have arisen from the story that, just before his execution, the last words Valentinus wrote were addressed to Asterius' daughter and signed 'from your Valentine'. Another story asserts that Valentinus secretly carried out Christian marriages, against the Emperor's orders, since serving soldiers were forbidden to marry, in order to save the husbands from having to serve in war.

There are many traditions regarding St Valentine as the patron saint of lovers, clearly many of them apocryphal, but February 14th has been celebrated since at least the 14th century and still appears in the Christian calendar.

So, in the midst of hearts and roses and romance, think carefully about what love really means and remember Valentinus, and many others of his time, and also, sadly, of today, whose love for others is an expression of their love of God.



DO YOU CARE ABOUT NATURE ? THWAITE COMMON TOAD PATROL NEEDS A NEW CO-ORDINATOR

Every Spring Toads, Frogs and Newts migrate from their wintering areas to ponds to breed. The annual migration on Thwaite Common involves crossing the road and individual amphibians risk being killed by traffic. Volunteers move and rescue those animals sat in the road over the evenings, usually starting in early February for about 6 weeks, when conditions warm and wet.

The Toad Patrol has recorded the numbers of Frogs, Toads and Newts, both rescued and killed,



for over 15 years. These figures are sent into a national database run by Froglife who amalgamate the numbers from hundreds of patrols from across the UK.

A new volunteer co-ordinator is required for Thwaite Common whose role involves producing a weekly rota for the Patrol and sending in the data produced from each night.








Report of the Ordinary Meeting of Erpingham with Calthorpe Parish Council held on Wednesday 8th January 2025

In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present, with apologies from one member and the County Councillor. There were no Declarations of Interest. The Council approved the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council on November 13th 2024. Under matters arising about the milestone, as the reply from Norfolk County Council appeared to contradict their previous advice the Clerk would ask the County Councillor to advise. On footpaths the Moorgate footbridge is expected to be re-opened by the end of January. On planning about the proposed radio base station installation, off The Street, Erpingham, no further info was available but the Clerk would repeat the request to the agent for a meeting.

In a short adjournment the Council heard about changes to the hygiene rules so the Wednesday coffee mornings would be subject to a stricter discipline on food preparation; more equipment would be acquired and the Village Hall kitchen had already been awarded 5 Hygiene Stars. The meeting resumed and on planning the extension at Folly Cottage, Eagle Road had been approved

In his finance report the Clerk had identified the CCLA as an alternative interest-bearing banker and asked members to research their website, while he prepared an application so a decision can be made at the next meeting. North Norfolk District Council had acknowledged next year's precept demand; the Clerk had written to the MUGA committee and the Football Club requesting this year's contributions. The Council were minded to review the MUGA contribution at the next meeting. The Council had instructed the bank to pay the January PAYE payment. The Council considered grants to local organisations – a record of previous year's awards had been circulated to members and the Council decided to award the following payments this year: Erpingham PCC £250.00, Calthorpe Church Friends £250.00, KIT £100.00 and Erpingham Village Hall £400.00. The Council approved payments for electricity, HMRC PAYE, the Info Commissioner renewal fee and the Clerk's salary [Nov, Dec].

On the play Area there was no report but on the rectification work, the quotations to address the three 'moderate' risk' issues were awaited and the Council asked the Clerk to advise members as they became available so the work can be progressed. The Council then considered any new village projects and how to prioritise and progress them.

The Council were keen to consult the 'Village' to build a 'wish list' of amenities or improvements for consideration, funding and implementation. Whilst it is important that members communicate this initiative, the Annual Parish Meeting this year would take on a different ambience and move to its own day (Wednesday 9th April). Refreshments would be provided and involvement of as many as possible participants would be sought.

The Clerk passed over 2024 computer records to the Chairman and the next ordinary meeting would be on March 12th 2025, and the District councillor advised that North Norfolk District Council sought to assist anyone who had difficulty over heating costs this winter.

Members raised concerns about the requirement to book to use recycling centres. The SAM sign would return shortly, the defibrillator has been checked and that the Safer Neighbourhoods meeting would take on a new format. The date for the Eagle Road works is still awaited from Norfolk County Council. The meeting closed at 20.45.






