

I have learned (or perhaps relearned) some important lessons since I have been unwell. Firstly, the power that kind words contain. Some people wrote their kind words, some just said an encouraging word, others a simple "how are you" and took the time to wait for an answer. I learned again how healing words can be. But more than that, they gave me a sense of worth, and perhaps there are times when we all need that. Then because my vulnerability made others open up to me I realised again how much we all carry. Inside us all are the scars and wounds, some of which are still raw, that life inflicts on us. Then out of the blue from 60 years ago the jingle that helped us remember the Girl Guide promise came to mind

'Trusty, loyal, helpful, friendly, courteous, kind'

Not a bad foundation for living and not far from the 'fruits of the spirit' which St Paul speaks of in his letter to the Christians living in Galatia. They are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control. My belief is that wherever we see these gifts being lived, we see the Holy Spirit at work.

I found this poem which might help us on our way, not brilliant poetry but the sentiments are good:

Let us be kind

The way is long and lonely

And human hearts are asking for this blessing only,






