

June letter


Until very recently I was a governor at Erpingham School and a foundation governor at that. This was because Erpingham is a Church of England School and this meant it has TWO Ofsted type inspections! The Ofsted we know of and another one called SIAMS standing for Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist schools. It was with somewhat of a surprise that I read that as part of that SIAMS inspection the children are expected to have been taught, and have an understanding of, the Trinity. I wonder how many of you can explain the Trinity never mind primary school age children? I know of a vicar (not near here) who always managed to be away at Trinity so that he left the preaching to the Lay Minister that weekend! However, we had to have a go and the school and the church team at Assemblies once a week, and Messy Church, where the whole school came to the church twice a term, tried their best to help the children understand the Trinity - the three in one - one God as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. As a simple illustration of this we started by showing them pictures of King Charles who was a father, a son and a husband: Three persons in one.

We really thought we had done a pretty good job, but after the inspection the report said that although the children understood what the Trinity meant the inspector didn't feel they really knew how to apply it to their lives. Somewhat of a disappointment I have to say but that's inspections for you! I don't know about you, but I thought that was a big ask of adults never mind young children!

So I had to think what I would have said if I had been asked. I suppose I would say that the Trinity should remind us that as human beings we are not alone but we are all part of a community. In this modern day world it is very easy to be alone. Nowadays many people work from home and it is so easy to spend our time staring at a computer all day and communicating with others solely via e-mail, what's app, face time or one of the hundred and one other ways of getting stuck onto a machine rather than meeting up face to face. I was very much aware of this having been in hospital and housebound at home when the friendly face at the door reminded me I was part of a community. I was not alone. The telephone and e mails were very welcome, but that face to face was what reminded me and made me really feel part of our community. We, who were created in the image and likeness of the Triune God, were created for community. As a community we can achieve so much more than we can alone. Trinity Sunday was on May 26th and the period of Trinity lasts through to the end of October, so I hope we can use this time especially to foster our sense of community. Are there people I know who are alone and would welcome a visit? Can I volunteer perhaps to help those asking for help? Can we make everyone feel welcome? Can I at least not ignore the problems that so many of our fellow human beings have and do what I can to try and make them aware that they are part of a community and not on their own? Others have helped me recently, so I must try.

Peter Gidman will be taking over as Administrator of the 200 Club as from 1st April 2024.



Report of Annual Meeting of Erpingham with Calthorpe Parish Council On Wednesday 8th May 2024

In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present; apologies from one member and the County Councillor were received. In first business Mr Goodlife was re-elected Chairman, nemcon and he signed his Declaration of Acceptance of Appointment. Mr G Cox was appointed vice-Chairman and member responsibilities were agreed. There were no Declarations of interest. Under finance the Council adopted the Accounts for 2023-2024 and the accounts and Cashbook were signed by the Chairman and Clerk. The Council approved the AGAR Certificate of Exemption and received the Annual Report of the Internal Auditor for 2023-24. There were no items or issues for further consideration by the Council. The Council approved the AGAR Section 1 (the Annual Governance Statement 2023-24), then the AGAR Section 2 (the Accounting Statements 2023-24). The forms were signed by the Chairman and Clerk. The Council re-appointed Roger Canwell as Internal Auditor for the current year and the Clerk as Responsible Financial Officer.

The Council reviewed the budget for 2024-2025, and it was adopted. The Chairman identified a series of village improvements which the Council could address with available funding. The Clerk was asked to see if a higher interest rate account was available. The Council approved payments due for the payroll service, the Norfolk ALC, subscription, their website fee, the internal audit fee, the annual insurance, premium and the Clerk's salary.

The Council approved the minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on March 13th 2024, and the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Council held on the same day. Under matters arising (A140 bus stop bike rack) the landowner had now given permission for the bike rack so this amenity can now be progressed. Under planning the livestock buildings and solar panels at Orchard Farm, Eagle Road, and the single storey extension at 16 John Franklin Way had both been approved. The Council has no objection to the demolition of existing and new rear extension at Flint Cottage, Calthorpe Road.

There was no report for the play Area and the Council would have a site meeting for adhoc repairs and the Clerk would arrange for a contractor to look at the site. The Council considered their interface with the Village Hall Committee and members agreed that attendance at Village Hall meetings should be by rotation. Plans were to have a walk-round of the site to review boundary issues, prepare a memo of understanding of responsibilities, and re-establish the boundary as the new footpath takes shape. The Clerk was asked to check with NALC re support if any for addressing encroachment issues.

In reports – The Chairman asked Cllr J Toye (North Norfolk District Council) to report any issues and he outlined his new responsibilities and the Council discussed with him the new path to Eagle Road and well as how to attract funding. In members' reports the Council asked the Clerk to include an item on the agenda to consider the format of parish council meetings. The condition of Chapel Road was raised and this is being addressed by Norfolk County Council. The defibrillator had been serviced at nil cost. In his report the Clerk awaits the date for reversing the Eagle Road priority scheme. The next meeting is on July 10th 2024. With no other business the meeting closed at 20.55..
