February letter

The Grumpy Old Men's Club meets for a pint and a chat more or less regularly at our local late on a Friday afternoon. About two months ago we got around to discussing Christmas trees. "I leave mine up all year round", said Billy. We looked at him suspiciously. "Yes," he added, "and when Christmas comes round I plug it in, turn on the lights and away you go." Our suspicions deepened. "I keep it in the loft. All those flashing lights – you can't watch the television in peace!" All around us the strings of the pub's Christmas lights winked away like a thousand fireflies practicing Morse code; very unlike the usual quiet atmosphere of the place.



I think Billy has a point. Since childhood one of my Christmas pleasures, which has grown over the years, is to sit at the end of a day of festivities with all the lights turned off except the coloured lights on the Christmas tree. I wind down by letting the steady lights gradually take over. In the stillness the tree decorations begin to manifest their memories. Just below the star on the top is the little recorder playing painted angel we bought years ago in Dresden. She hovers above a long, faded pale blue strip of ribbon draped either side of the tree. It was part of the elaborate wrapping round a wedding present sent to us by three German friends. Two sparrow sized birds in delicate foil, one gold one silver given to us by a child in one of Pauline's classes. And so on.

Other ways of relaxing and becoming still that appeal to me include walking slowly amidst the reedbeds at Cley or Hickling Broad (the birdwatching binoculars chiefly for show) and listening to the rustle of the reeds; leaning over Cromer pier on a soft summer evening after the obligatory fish and chips watching the wavelets lap on the beach; or sitting in one of our beautiful medieval churches just to feel its quietness. And with our mental defences down we can be more open to God as well.

Slowing down and becoming still is only half of what we can achieve. By looking within ourselves we can learn to face up honestly to our failings as well as our strengths. It can bring an inner peace and calm in a special way. A word of warning however, do not expect such calm to appear without a long, patient period of practice and do not expect any exalted feelings to last for long at any one time. Life is not like that. But this searching for a lasting inner calm has been the practice of Christianity, Islam, Hinduism and many other religions over the centuries as well as for anyone without religious beliefs but who can sense the reality of something beyond the merely material world.

HEALING MINISTRY

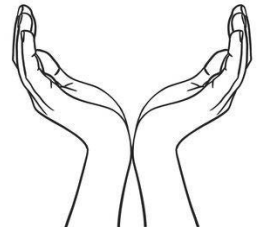
From the earliest times Christians were involved in prayers for healing.

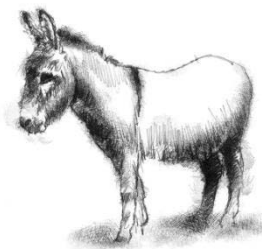


Looking ahead and reaching out to all the creative people in our benefice

News from the Ingworth Parish Council

The Parish Council met on 27th November, now with nearly a full complement of councillors (6 out of 7 seats filled) - there is one vacancy. If anyone is interested, please contact the Clerk.

A date has been agreed for training in the use of the defibrillator, which is located on the side of the Reading Room. It will be on Saturday 14th February at 10.00 am held at Banningham and Colby Community Hall, in conjunction with our neighbouring parishes. It's free but there are limited places so contact the Clerk if you would like to attend – it could save a life!

The annual safety inspection of the playground has taken place, and the report is on the Council's website. We'll be looking to replace the dilapidated picnic table in the spring as well as carrying out some safety work on the trees which are encroaching on the play equipment.

District Councillor John Toye was in attendance and updated councillors on a range of topics including the proposed local government reorganisation which will see the District and County Council structure in Norfolk change to either one, two or three new authorities covering Norfolk.

Further data from the Speed Awareness Monitor has revealed some vehicles entering the village along Cromer Road at 60 mph, with many more exceeding the 30mph speed limit. Councillors are meeting with the police in December to discuss these concerns and a meeting is also to be held with our County Councillor and the County Highways Engineer. The Chairman has attended a meeting of other local parish council representatives, convened by Aylsham Town Council. The networking event was useful and well received and was to be a regular meeting.
