

THE CHURCHYARD AT THWAITE

Thwaite churchyard, covering two-thirds of a Norfolk acre, is bounded on three sides by farmland and on the fourth by motor road. Some eight years ago, it occurred to the Churchwardens and PCC that, in such a heavily worked environment, it would make sense to try and create a sanctuary for wild creatures and flora.

Willow Warbles

As much to the point, our practice of cutting the grass three times each year (May, July, September), while giving a neat appearance for several weeks of the summer, concealed an explosion of robust weeds, principally stinging nettles, docks and bracken. Beneath Robert Wright's strimmers was a subterranean riot. The priority was to reduce the fertility of the soil: not easy, as you can imagine, in a thousand-year-old burial-yard.

In 2017, the churchyard was placed in the Norfolk Wildlife Trust Churchyard Conservation Scheme. The new approach has Robert make just a single cut, in September, to allow wild flowers time to set their seed; and for volunteers to cart off and burn the grass cuttings so that, in decomposing, they should not add to the ground's fertility. Paths are mown only to the graves of this century. I planted a mixed-species hedge on the south side, in part to compete with the bracken and, in part, to screen out blown soil from the rich farm fields. The hedge is now tall enough to be "laid": that is, the stems cut half-way through at the base and laid at an acute angle, so thick growth sprouts both from the stem and the cut stool. The docks have been dug out, one by dratted one. Nettles are gradually being banished to the sides where they shall provide food for butterfly larvae. The bracken, which had advanced under the old regime fully ten yards from the south boundary..., but I shall come to the bracken later.

Wilding is very much harder labour than clipping yews, pruning roses and cutting the lawn at weekends.


The results of the scheme have been promising. The 65 wildflower species found by David North in his survey of 2017 had expanded to 78 by 2023 and to 92 this year (as recorded by Karen Fidgen). Handsome cornfield weeds, such as corncockle and hedgerow cranesbill, long ago vanished from the arable, have begun to colonise the yard. Yellow rattle, a grass parasite, is making space for flowers in the rough sward.

Wild flowers, like the rainbow, come and go but the trend appears to be upward.

As to birds, there has been a multiplication of migrant warblers such as blackcap, chiffchaff, willow warbler and common and lesser whitethroat. A Dartford warbler, seen readily enough in Spain but a rarity in these islands, spent two days at Thwaite in July, 2024. The seal of approval came from a hen sparrowhawk, who took up residence for that whole summer, sometimes in the bell openings of the tower and sometimes on the cross atop the chancel end. Her mate occasionally made an appearance, flying in wide circles, looking busy. She returned this year, but the place seems to have lost its charm for her.

Fifteen butterfly species have been counted by Mrs Fidgen in the last two years. This summer was particularly strong in ringlet, gatekeeper and meadow brown. (Bats, moths, lizards, gall wasps, rabbits and lichens on request.)

There remains the bracken, which is playing a sort of Grandmother's Footsteps. I turn my back a moment and it moves a foot forward. Bash it, smash it, cut it, pull it, dig it, burn it, bite it, put it in a stew: it is back, with a leer, by next morning. Whether we succeed in controlling it, or it shall remain as the Devil's Share, the years will show.
