October letter

Two spells in the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital, where I had excellent care, knocked the stuffing out of me both physically and mentally. Worse, we had to cancel our annual break on a small island measuring roughly a mile and a half by a half mile. The resident population is about ninety. There is an very good village shop, a modest bar, a few cafes, a family run fresh fish shop and a small farm selling fresh home grown produce. You can also hire motor or sailing boats from the island's two boatyards.

It is where I press my "reset" button; where the dross of the past year is filtered out. The scenery is beautiful and the wildlife interesting. With only a mile or so of concreted track cars are few and far between and the noise of traffic absent. To get anywhere on the island you walk. It's what legs are made for. To journey to neighbouring islands you travel by launch and you walk around those, too. A pair of binoculars, a few bird, plant and seashore books for reference are all you need in the daytime and there is plenty of time for reading or thinking in the evenings. You cannot buy a newspaper on the island because by the time the papers would reach the island from the mainland the news would be out of date. I don't turn on the television; somehow the world gets by without my opinions for a fortnight or so.

What makes the place so special for me is the sense of community. Everyone has a place, a role to fill and, therefore, everyone has a value and is aware of it. Witness the well- run community hall, the locally manned fire and ambulance station. The island has two voluntary first-responders. The small church and churchyard are cared for and in the summer there are Sunday services on alternate weeks served by visiting priests. Villagers care for the public toilets, they empty the rubbish bins where day trippers can leave their wrappings. Parts of the island are nature reserves and volunteers keep them tidy – and clear up any mess left by careless visitors.

Pauline and I have visited for a number of years and we know several locals by their first names. We have become aware of the issues that concern them and can empathise with them. We can feel, rather than define, the sense of worth that the islanders have and their self-reliance.

The communities within the Scarrowbeck benefice mirror the community on the island although without the insularity that pervades island communities. The village hall, the local school, the pub and the church are kept alive by real people working in teams who interact in personal contact; not the soulless supermarkets or the second hand social media with so much misinformation as well as fact.

The football manager Arsene Wenger said, "The act of playing for the team makes every individual stronger". I go along with that.





Alby Gardens – a Little Gem

Search and Rescue helicopters are a familiar sight in the skies above Norfolk – and their brave crews have saved hundreds of lives over the years. But what's it like to be part of one of their missions? Former Sea King pilot Jim Bellingall will give an illustrated talk about his experiences at the Aldborough Church Room, on 24th October 2024 at 2.45pm for 3.00 pm, in aid of Hospice Ethiopia UK.

In 1953 the first East Anglian Search and Rescue helicopters were introduced at RAF Horsham St Faith, now Norwich Airport, and in 1963 they were transferred to RAF Coltishall. The bright yellow helicopters have been involved with many rescues of both military and civilian personnel, sometimes in the most challenging of conditions.

SUMMARY OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 29TH AUGUST 2024

Councillors met for their third quarterly meeting of the year recently and among other things they discussed the need for a replacement Councillor following the resignation of Gill Chambers at the May meeting – thanks to Gill for her valuable contribution over the years. If anyone is interested in knowing more about what being a Parish Councillor involves contact the Clerk or speak to one of the existing Councillors – Belinda Northey, Annmarie Gibbons, Ian Sims or Tracey Yardley.

Following the success of the social event which followed the Annual Parish Meeting in May it was agreed to hold another social event for parishioners at Christmas - details to be announced. It was also agreed that a tree with Christmas lights should be erected on the Village Green this year – something that you won't be able to miss! And staying with the Village Green, spring bulbs will be planted this autumn to give a splash of colour early next year.

Councillors also considered a perennial problem for the village – speeding – and agreed to approach the County Council with the view to getting a 20-mph speed limit imposed. This will likely be a long process but hopefully data from the Speed Awareness Monitor in the village will help our case. Councillors also discussed the next inspection of the road bridge – due next year; the on-going work to install the cable from the windfarm which will pass close to the village; liaison with the National Trust and fundraising by the Friends of Ingworth Church.

Councillors also approved the purchase of a replacement "Springy Bee" for the playground along with a goalpost to improve the facilities for the young and young at heart! So, look out for those and give them a go.

Finally, the Council is fortunate in having some funds in reserves which it would like to spend on improving the village – and would like to hear FROM YOU! Report of the Annual meeting of Erpingham with Calthorpe Parish Council held on Wednesday 11th September 2024

In the chair Rob Goodliffe welcomed all those present; apologies from one member and the County Councillor were received. There were no Declarations of interest. Before adjourning the Chairman took Item 5 (Planning) and asked Cllr J Toye to give the Council an update; he advised that he had written a response to the agents for the mast proposal, which the Clerk would circulate for members; also that the application had now been registered so the Council may expect to be consulted in due course. He pointed out that the application, as amended, was now 'permitted development'. The Clerk would respond to the agent offering an opportunity for dialogue. Cllr J Toye then gave brief report about North Norfolk District Council matters. The meeting resumed. The Council approved the minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Parish Council on July 10th 2024. Under matters arising on verge cutting Norfolk County Council had advised that the Eagle Road section had been missed off the routine cutting and the contractor would be advised; the Council's grounds contractor had agreed to undertake additional work there so the Clerk would ask him to undertake one cut before the winter. The schedule itself had been circulated to members. The Clerk would ask Norfolk County Council what action was intended following the damage to the milestone on the A140.

On paths (Village Hall to Eagle Road) the Chairman was arranging a meeting at North Norfolk District Council to further the project by asking for a vegetation cutback along the route; he was starting to prepare a grant application. Following the enquiry about the footbridge over the Bure, Norfolk County Council had repeated their advice that the route is closed <u>By Order</u>. On the bus shelter bike rack, the Clerk had now received 3 quotations and applied for a grant from Norfolk Community Foundation; the work would probably be completed in October. The Council decided their preferred builder, so the Clerk can progress. On the parish website a council member had been added to the system as an administrator to review non-parish council content.

Under finance the Clerk had arranged the transfer of current account monies to the Council's interest-bearing account. Members would continue to seek a better return. The Clerk would arrange the next HMRC PAYE payment in early October when the amount is due. The Council approved payments due for Erpingham Village Hall, hall hire, North Norfolk District Council, bin collections charge, the Clerk's expenses [March-August], and grass cutting.

There were no safety issues in the play area and the Chairman signed the weekly inspection book. The waste bin is now being emptied regularly, but the Clerk was asked to follow up with NNDC to see if a rebate can be obtained since the collections have only recently started. One item of equipment had been removed and a second repaired.

In members' Reports the Council heard an update on the SAM sign, SNAP, the defibrillator and the MUGA cleaning. There is a plan to have a seat + information sign at the end of the carpark. The next meeting is on Wednesday November 13th 2024, to include a budget review and setting of next year's Precept. In open meeting the Village Hall steps/slope renewal was discussed and the Council advised that the project was at 'builder discussion' stage. With no other business the meeting closed at 20.50.
